



Warnham's Neighbourhood Development Plan final round of consultation - Friday 17 August to Friday 12 October 2018

The Warnham Neighbourhood Development Plan has now been submitted to Horsham District Council. This follows the recent consultation (known as "Regulation 14"), during which many comments were received. These were analysed and the Plan updated where necessary.

There is still an opportunity for you to comment on the Plan, with the second and final round of formal consultation taking place between Friday 17 August and Friday 12 October 2018.

At the end of the consultation period, all comments received will be sent to the Independent Examiner, who will formally review the Plan to ensure that it meets the statutory regulations for neighbourhood planning.

If the Examination is successful, the Plan will progress to a local, public referendum. All those on the electoral roll, living within the Parish, will have an opportunity to vote on whether the Plan should form part of the strategic planning framework for Horsham. A result of 51% or more will mean that Plan is adopted (or 'made').

The NDP defines proposals for development in the parish to 2031. It is defined in ten policies and is based on Horsham's Local Plan – the Horsham District Planning Framework (HDPF) – and the findings of public consultation and surveys in the parish. The HDPF makes provision for the development of 16,000 new dwelling over the district, of which at least 1,500 are expected across the district in villages such as Warnham.
